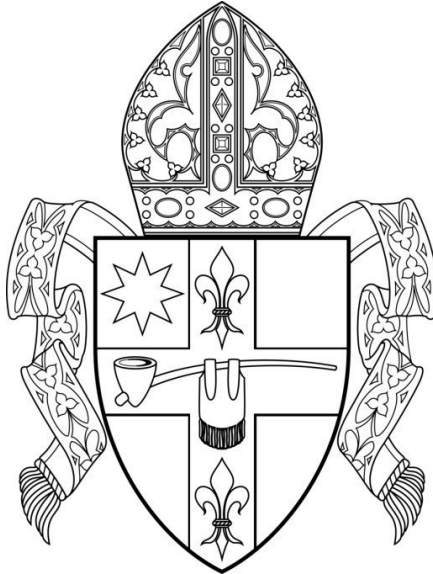

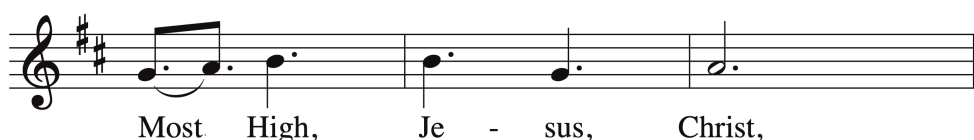
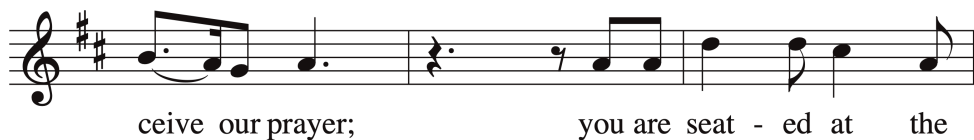

Nicene Creed





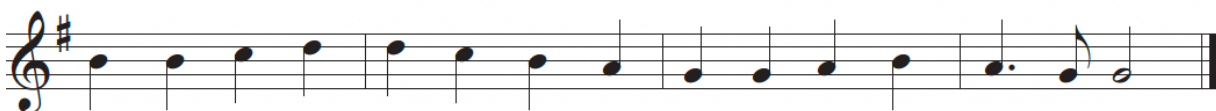
