

6th Grade: MARRIAGE

OVERVIEW

OBJECTIVE: To identify ways to act in virtue and charity within marriage and family.

MAIN CONCEPTS:

- A marriage entails sacrifice.
- A good marriage is full of virtue.
- Through marriage the husband and wife have graced opportunity to become more like Christ.

PLANNING DIRECTIONS:

Choose the components you wish to use given the time you have and the needs of your students.

INTRODUCTION

2 min

Summarize today's theme:

Through these lessons we hope to become familiar with the vocations to which God calls people so that you will be able to follow his call always. Right now, you are in the single state of life, but someday God may call you to a particular vocation—married life, priesthood, or religious life. Today's focus is on marriage.

OPENING PRAYER

2 min

Let us draw near to God during today's lesson. Read John 15:13

Pray a simple prayer from the heart or: Lord, it is difficult to sacrifice our own ways and will. As we look to you, we see your strong example. Please send us your spirit so that we may live as you did. Amen.

MARRIAGE

"No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends."- John 15:13

ACTIVITY

VIRTUE ACTING

Act out this dialogue several times, with different students pretending to have different moods.

Student A. Good morning.

Student B. Good morning.

Student A. Could you please pass the cereal?

Student B. Sure.

Student A. Thank you.

1. Student A is patient; Student B is generous
2. Student A is understanding; Student B is irritable
3. Student A is irritable; Student B is irritable
4. Student A is irritable; Student B is lazy
5. Student A is kind; Student B is self-centered
6. Student A is cheerful; Student B is peaceful

How does this activity show what family life should be like?



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ACTIVITY

10 min

Virtue Acting

Have pairs of students act out dialogue with the virtues and vices listed.

Ask the students about how these short conversations show how family life can be wonderful... or not so great, depending on your attitude.



ESTABLISHING THE CONCEPTS

20 min

Virtue and Sacrifice in Marriage

1. This reading may be advanced for some students, so break down phrases with them to ensure understanding. Read through the reading page individually, in small groups, or as a class.

2. Use the questions to spark class discussion, or assign students to write answers to the questions.

ESTABLISHING THE CONCEPTS

SACRED SACRIFICE IN MARRIAGE

Most people are called to marriage—to wholeheartedly love their spouse and to joyfully welcome children. The purpose of marriage is for a man and woman to help each other get to heaven and to teach their children to do the same. Like any vocation, marriage must be discerned, not assumed.

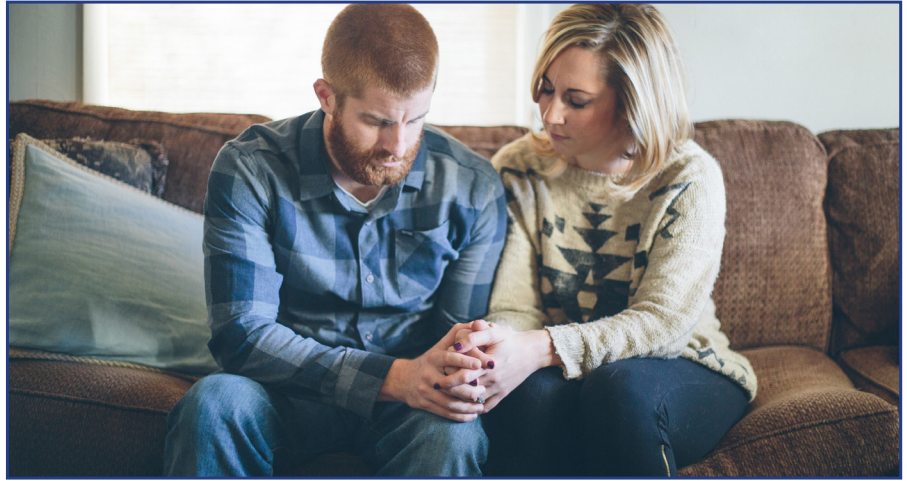
Marriage can be an incredibly beautiful vocation. After all, scripture teaches that marriage is a symbol of how Christ loves the Church!

A very common mistake, though, is for young people to think that marriage does not entail sacrifice. Sometimes it seems like vocations such as priesthood or religious life are far more difficult because they require celibacy. But just ask any married couple; they will tell you that marriage involves great sacrifice and that it can be very challenging at times.

The world needs good, holy marriages! If you feel called to marriage, strive for virtue, pray for your future spouse, and, above all, be patient! Wait to find someone who loves Jesus Christ and the Church, and who will truly love and honor you. God will answer your prayers in His time.

Be Curious

1. According to this reading, what needs to be present in a good marriage?
2. How do you think a person can learn to be patient waiting for the right person to marry?
3. What is the ultimate purpose of marriage?
4. What is the one thing that marriage involves that may surprise young people?
5. Define “assume.” Define “discern.” Why do you think it is important for the vocation to marriage to be discerned rather than assumed?
6. Compare how the relationship between a husband and wife is like the relationship between Christ and the Church (hint: think about how a husband should treat his wife, etc.)

Scripture Matching

2. Note that some acts of charity correspond with more than one scripture passage. Ask students why they picked a certain scripture passage.

REFLECTIVE PRAYER

5 min

Prayer of St. Francis

Read aloud the Prayer of St. Francis as a class.

Then have the students silently reflect and pray about the prayer, through journaling or quiet prayer.

VOCAL PRAYER

2 min

1. If you have not previously in another lesson, introduce the prayer:

Mary's "yes" to God can be our "yes" to following Him both today and later in our vocation.

2. Students pray the The Angelus.



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REFLECTIVE PRAYER

PRAYER OF SAINT FRANCIS

Lord, make me a channel of thy peace,
that where there is hatred, I may bring love;
that where there is wrong,
I may bring the spirit of forgiveness;
that where there is discord, I may bring harmony;
that where there is error, I may bring truth;
that where there is doubt, I may bring faith;
that where there is despair, I may bring hope;
that where there are shadows, I may bring light;
that where there is sadness, I may bring joy.

Lord, grant that I may seek rather to
comfort than to be comforted;
to understand, than to be understood;
to love, than to be loved.

For it is by self-forgetting that one finds.
It is by forgiving that one is forgiven.
It is by dying that one awakens to Eternal Life.

REFLECTION:

- Do you need God's grace in particular areas, in order to help your family?
- Is there discord or sadness in your family? How can you help bring harmony or joy, even in small ways?
- Are there people you need to forgive in your heart?
- How can you open yourself to Jesus, so that when you give to others it is not just your own effort, but God's love spilling over from your heart?

Leader: The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary

All: that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.
